Attendance:

- Students who had **PERFECT ATTENDANCE** for the month of September received a perfect attendance bracelet.
 - In your teacher assignment letter, I included a letter explaining how I was going to be focusing on attendance throughout the year and students who have perfect attendance – which includes no tardies (arriving to school after the morning announcements) and no early dismissals would be rewarded.
- Being present for the **ENTIRE** school day is extremely important to your child's learning.
 - A total of 312 students started out with perfect attendance, but 91 students were either late to school or left early.
 - October is a new month. All students have the opportunity to have perfect attendance!!!

Attendance PART TWO:

- Chronically absent letters were sent home to parents of children who have missed more than 10% of school
 - Chronic absences are determined by the number of school days (opportunities to learn) by the number of absences a child has for the month.
 - What does this mean??? If your child was absent for three or more days during the month, your child was chronically absent!
 - Again, each month is a new start as the number of school days increases.
 - Coming to school is important.
 - Any parent who receives two chronically absent letters will be asked to come to school to meet with the attendance team.

Testing

All Testing has been completed!!!

- The teachers are busy using this information to provide the appropriate instruction for your child.
- We are happy to be finished with testing and can now work on daily focused instruction.

Newsletter

- I have decided to try to go as green as possible. Last year I would send home the monthly newsletter to all parents in both English and Spanish.
 - This year I will be utilizing School Messenger to send home the newsletter.
 - The newsletter is also posted in the Marvin School website.
 - I have a list of parents who do not have access to email or the internet.
 - The newsletter is being printed and sent home to these families only.
 - After sending out last month's newsletter I found that many email addresses were **Blocked** and that meant the newsletter did not get to you.
 - I sent home a request to remove the block from the email. In the meantime, I have discovered that Blocked means that emails and messages from either myself or the school district went into your SPAM or JUNK files. Please be sure to allow emails from the Norwalk Public Schools and from the Marvin PTA and from me to enter your inbox. It is important to stay informed especially now that I am trying to go paper-free.

I need your help

- If you walk your dog at Marvin School – please be sure to pick up after it.
 - One of the best things about the location of Marvin is the wide open space we share with the dog park.
 - One of the worst things about the location of the school is the dog park.
 - Please remind anyone you know who walks their dog near the school to pick up after it!!
